## CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND AND WALES

*An extract from the letter from the President and Vice-President on behalf of all the Bishops of the Conference - for full version, see link on the website.*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In response to the Coronavirus pandemic, so many aspects of our lives must change. This includes the ways in which we publicly express our faith. It is very clear that, following official advice and in order to keep each other safe, save lives and support the NHS, at this time we must not gather for public acts of worship in our churches. This will begin from Friday evening, 20<sup>th</sup> March 2020, until further notice. (...)

However, the celebration of Mass, Sunday by Sunday and day by day, will take place without a public congregation.

Knowing that the Mass is being celebrated; joining in spiritually in that celebration; watching the live-streaming of the Mass; following its prayers at home; making an act of spiritual communion: this is how we share in the Sacrifice of Christ in these days. These are the ways in which we will sanctify Sunday, and indeed every day.

We want everyone to understand that in these emergency circumstances, and for as long as they last, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is removed. This is, without doubt, the teaching of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2181). This pandemic is the 'serious reason' why this obligation does not apply at this time. (...)

The second vital aspect of these challenging times is our care for each other. There are so many ways in which we are to do this: being attentive to the needs of our neighbour, especially the elderly and vulnerable; contributing to our local food banks; volunteering for charitable initiatives and organisations; simply keeping in touch by all the means open to us. During these disturbing and threatening times, the rhythm of the prayer of the Church will continue. Please play your part in it. The effort of daily kindness and mutual support for all will continue and increase. Please play your part in this too. For your commitment to this, we thank you.

## OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

*During these challenging times, we will be working hard to keep our parish website up-to-date with information and resources to help us maintain our parish communication, community spirit and prayer life.*

**NO public Masses or other services (such as Stations of the Cross) will take place until further notice.**

- *Fr Gregory will celebrate daily Mass and Sunday Mass alone, without a public congregation. Mass intentions can be sent to the parish office, preferably by email.*
- *The Church will be open for private prayer on Sundays at 10am, and on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday at the normal time of daily masses 9-9.30am. Everyone must observe Government and Health safety guidelines at all times, washing hands and keeping distances while in church and on their way in and out. If you are on the high risk category, or required to self-isolate because you (or anyone in your household) have any mild symptom of the virus, you must stay away from public places, including the church.*
- *The First Holy Communion and Confirmation programmes, including classes, have been suspended until further notice.*
- *Baptisms currently booked will be postponed.*
- *Parish groups and Hall users have suspended their activities. No one is to use the Annexe at this time.*
- *The SVP has halted its collection of items for the food bank BUT we are encouraging parishioners coming to church, to bring food donations where possible. Our parish will be working with the Hayes Community (Hayes schools, St. Mary's...) to identify any vulnerable residents of Hayes who may need support at this time, if you know of any fellow parishioners, friends or neighbours who might need help please email the Parish Office. See further details on our parish website.*

**The Archbishop encourages 'every Catholic - individuals, couples and families - to create, if there is not one already present, a simple shrine in their home, with a crucifix and religious images, to provide a focus until that blessed day when we are able to gather in our churches once more.'**
